ADVENTURE THEATRE ANNOUNCES ITS 60th ANNIVERSARY SEASON

8 WORKS WILL BE PRODUCED IN 2011-2012: INCLUDES INTERNATIONAL TOURING PRODUCTION AND 3 WORLD PREMIERES

GLEN ECHO, MD – <u>Adventure Theatre</u>, the longest-running children's theatre in the Washington, D.C. area, announces its 60th Anniversary Season. This very special season includes an international touring production, a partnership with Rockville's Musical Theatre Center and 7 main stage productions featuring three world premieres. The 60th year celebration continues Adventure Theatre's commitment to the highest quality children's literature brought to life through captivating performances.

The fun begins with Lilly's Purple Plastic Purse starring Helen-Hayes nominated Felicia Curry (Mirandy and Brother Wind) as Lilly. For the holiday season, Adventure Theatre is debuting the world premiere of Tony-Award Nominated and Olivier Award Winning Ken Ludwig's 'Twas The Night Before Christmas, based on the poem of the same title and directed by Jerry Whiddon. Adventure Theatre's initiative to bring diversity to the stage, "African American Adventures," continues with the 50th Year Anniversary production of Ezra Jack Keat's *The Snowy Day*, based on the first children's book to feature an African American as the main character. This musical is adapted by Helen Hayes Winning playwright, David Emerson Toney with music and lyrics by Darius Smith. The fun continues with Alexander and the Terrible, Horrible, No Good, Very Bad Day, featuring Broadway and Washington, D.C. favorite Sandy Bainum as Alexander's mother, directed by Gail Humphries Mardirosian. Having completed a successful in-school tour in 2011 (over 13,000 students served), Adventure Theatre is pleased to bring back its production of Just A Dream: The Green Play in spring 2012. Just A Dream: The Green Play is also scheduled for an overseas run with Singapore Repertory Theatre's The Little Company (TLC), in Singapore and Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia- August 4 – September 25, 2011, marking Adventure Theatre's first international production. Adventure Theatre's final world premiere for the anniversary season is Five Little Monkeys ©, based on the series of books by Eileen Christelow and directed by Karin Abromaitis. AT also presents its fourth play of Laura Numeroff's If You Give series with, If You Give A Moose A Muffin, starring DC favorite Michael Russotto as the Moose and directed by Jeremy Skidmore, in which a friendly but messy moose visits the little boy for even more mischievous fun. Finally, Adventure Theatre is partnering with Rockville's Musical Theatre Center for the premiere of the theatre for young audiences version of Biq, The Musical, starring DC favorite, Kurt Boehm; adapted for the stage by Jeff Frank (First Stage Milwaukee) and Michael J. Bobbitt, directed by Michael J. Bobbitt.
