## **Audition Requirements:**

- · Completed Scholarship Application

- · Vocal: Prepare selections from two contrasting songs; a ballad and an up-tempo. Select 16-32 measures (about one minute per song) that best demonstrate your vocal ability. It is acceptable to start in the middle of a song if you choose. (An accompanist will be provided on the day of auditions. Please bring sheet music in the appropriate key. Students may choose to sing a capella.)
- · Dance: Please wear appropriate attire to allow freedom of movement, as well as ballet or jazz shoes (if you have them).

  Jeans and hard-sole shoes are not permitted. No bare midriffs. Hair longer than chin length must be pulled back from the face.
